Below find updates and reports of the activities within the Police Department for the month of June 2025:

**June 2025 Training Update:**

**Countywide Active Assailant Event Training**

Every first responder agency in Pinellas County agreed on a standardized response policy. This enables all the agencies to integrate and act as one in the event of an active assailant event. Training is eight hours long.

- Andy DeLay taught the training along with other countywide agency instructors

**Countywide Reunification Taskforce Training**

Pinellas County has established a multi-agency taskforce to assist in the reunification of victims with their families after a large scale catastrophic events. Training was a partial day.

- Noy Southivongrath represents Kenneth City and provides the services of translator, clerical assistant, and bus driver to the taskforce.

**Taser Instructor Training**

Axon requires that trainers be certified in their curriculum to be Axon Taser Instructors. This training is two days long. Instructors are required to qualify on all of the different Taser devices. Training also includes how to teach de-escalation and put together scenario based training in a safe manner.

**Annual Patrol Shotgun Training**

Certified patrol shotgun officers and firearm instructors trained on and tested the newly proposed Criminal Justice Standards Training Commission patrol shotgun curriculum. This included separate training exercises and new state qualification course.

**Sexual Abuse Response Team (SART)**

This is a countywide taskforce with law enforcement agencies and victim advocate agencies collaboratively work together to combat sexual abuse. Countywide statistics are reviewed, new techniques, training, and initiatives are discussed.

**Active Assailant Event Committee**

The committee consists of lead law enforcement trainers. The committee decides the curriculum of the countywide AAE training, potential venues, and other logistical needs.

**Why Not to Use No-Knock Search Warrants Training**

Online training on the dangers to both officers and community members when using no knock search warrants. Discussion on prohibition of no-knock warrants. Better alternatives, techniques and best practices were discussed.

## **Patrol:**

Officers continued to conduct Town business area patrols, for ongoing homeless subject complaints. The goal still is to provide a safe alternative for the homeless subjects, such as Safe Harbor and Pinellas Hope, as well as other resources, to create a positive resolution for everyone. Officers continued to conduct directed patrol of all Town parks and Town Hall for suspicious activity/persons.

Officers on midnight shift placed Third Watch and If I Were a Thief notices throughout the Town as they checked closed business locations after hours. Officers conducted House Checks as requested by homeowners whose property was unattended.

The Police Department continues to address traffic concerns throughout the town.

**The Police Department has been doing numerous traffic details to address resident concerns for speeders on both 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 49<sup>th</sup> Avenue as well as various location in town.**

Accreditation is the certification by an independent reviewing authority that an entity has met specific requirements and prescribed standards. Law enforcement agencies and Inspectors General in Florida can attain accredited status through the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, Inc. The agency is compelled to operate within specific guidelines. It is accountable to the Commission. The agency must stay in compliance with the standards set forth by the Commission in order to retain its accreditation.



The Kenneth City Police Department is currently a CFA Florida Accredited Law Enforcement Agency.
