Below are updates and reports of the activities within the Police Department for the month of July 2025:

July 2025 Training Update:

Annual Countywide Active Assailant Event Exercise

The county holds a multi-agency active assailant exercise every year before school starts. Training consists of officers from all over the county responding to engage a suspect with numerous victimized role players. After the event is neutralized, officers must implement emergency management coordination. Training was eight hours long.

Countywide Reunification Taskforce Training

Pinellas County has established a multi-agency taskforce to assist in the reunification of victims with their families after a large-scale catastrophic event. The county held a large-scale mock drill which dealt with the countywide active assailant training event. Task force members had to organize and reunite the role players with their families. Training was eight hours long.

- Noy Southivongrath represents Kenneth City and provides the services of translators, clerical assistant, and bus driver to the taskforce.

Countywide Active Assailant Event Exercise Meeting

Prior to the active assailant exercise there was a countywide meeting. This meeting was to coordinate all the attendees for this large-scale event. Attendees learned planning for the event and what is expected of each of them. This training course was four hours long.

CJSTC Lethality Assessment Training

State mandated training by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission. All officers are required to have this training. Officers learned the new required protocols for handling domestic violence calls. Training for this was one hour.

- All KCPD officers took this training.

Child Abduction Response Team (CART)

This is a state regional taskforce housed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. The taskforce responds to assist all law enforcement agencies with missing and abducted children. Training is two to four hours long.

- Detective Gibson represented KCPD. Due to his longstanding participation on the taskforce, he was selected to be a Volunteer Coordinator; part of his duties now includes coordinating volunteers that respond to search for abducted children.

Operating at the Speed of Trust

Online training for reducing inefficiencies and cultivating the craft of small organizations. Training in maximizing the natural and collective advantages of the members of small units. Training was an hour and a half.

FDOT & Target ZERO (Zero Fatalities & Serious Injuries) AWARD Presented to KENNETH CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT for commitment to Traffic Safety and Enforcement in our town:



ELEE Traffic Detail from July 1st, 2024 - March 31st, 2025.

During this time, KCPD conducted 1,163 Traffic Stops to which we were rewarded with the following free equipment:

1. Lighted Safety Vest value (Four Vests) \$100.
2. Stream light LED Styluses (Box of Seven) value \$105 (\$15 each).
3. 28' Heavy-Duty Pop-Up Cones (Five-Pack) \$200 value.
4. LTI Tru Speed S binocular style speed laser (\$1,500 Value)

KCPD received free Traffic resources valued at a total cost of \$1,905.

Patrol:

Officers continued to conduct Town business area patrols, for ongoing homeless subject complaints. The goal still is to provide a safe alternative for the homeless subjects, such as Safe Harbor and Pinellas Hope, as well as other resources, to create a positive resolution for everyone. Officers continued to conduct directed patrol of all Town parks and Town Hall for suspicious activity/persons.

Officers on midnight shift placed Third Watch and If I Were a Thief notices throughout the Town as they checked closed business locations after hours. Officers conducted House Checks as requested by homeowners whose property was unattended.

The Police Department continues to address traffic concerns throughout the town.

The Police Department has been doing numerous traffic details to address resident concerns for speeders on both 46th Avenue and 49th Avenue as well as various location in town.

Accreditation is the certification by an independent reviewing authority that an entity has met specific requirements and prescribed standards. Law enforcement agencies and Inspectors General in Florida can attain accredited status through the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, Inc. The agency is compelled to operate within specific guidelines. It is accountable to the Commission. The agency must stay in compliance with the standards set forth by the Commission in order to retain its accreditation.



The Kenneth City Police Department is currently a CFA Florida Accredited Law Enforcement Agency.
