Below are updates and reports on the activities within the Police Department for the month of November 2025:

November 2025 Training Update:

National White Collar Crime Center

National White Collar Crime Center provides numerous online training sessions. These included: Victim Centered Solutions to Elder Exploitation; AI Facilitated Fraud; Virtual Kidnapping; Deep Fakes an Introduction to Synthetic Media; Computer Network Foundations for Law Enforcement. Training was 6.5 hours long

Countywide Reunification Taskforce Training

Pinellas County has established a multi-agency taskforce to assist in the reunification of victims with their families after a large-scale catastrophic event. Members of the taskforce have been attending ongoing training. This training encompassed the new software system used to coordinate the different entities of the taskforce. The training session was three hours long.

DWI Detection and Standardized Field Sobriety Testing

This training was taught by the Institute of Police Technology and Management and was hosted by the Tarpon Springs Police Department. The course taught how to skillfully recognize and properly evaluate impaired driving suspects, from the initial observation of the vehicle to the arrest and processing of the suspect. The procedures taught are commissioned by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). This training was three days long.

Mental Health First Aid Training

This training certification was taught by National Council for Mental Wellbeing. The class was hosted by the Gulfport Police Department. The training will teach participants how to help someone who is developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crisis. It helps trainees identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders, and how to continuously assess for suicide risk and how to prevent death by suicide. Training for this was one day.

Developing Instructor Guides for Continuity, Consistency, and Accountability

Online training for creating lesson plans, instructor manuals, and student manuals for law enforcement training. Training included how to reduce liability and how to make training more standardized from instructor to instructor. Training was for one hour.

Patrol:

Officers continued to conduct Town business area patrols, for ongoing homeless subject complaints. The goal still is to provide a safe alternative for the homeless subjects, such as Safe Harbor and Pinellas Hope, as well as other resources, to create a positive resolution for everyone. Officers continued to conduct directed patrol of all Town parks and Town Hall for suspicious activity/persons.

Officers on midnight shift placed Third Watch and If I Were a Thief notices throughout the Town as they checked closed business locations after hours. Officers conducted House Checks as requested by homeowners whose property was unattended.

The Police Department continues to address traffic concerns throughout the town.

The Police Department has been doing numerous traffic details to address resident concerns for speeders on both 46th Avenue and 49th Avenue as well as various location in town. The Police Department has also been monitoring School Bus Stops ensuring motorist stop for stopped buses.

An accreditation program has long been recognized as a means of maintaining the highest standards of professionalism. Accreditation is the certification by an independent reviewing authority that an entity has met specific requirements and prescribed standards. Law enforcement agencies and Inspectors General in Florida can attain accredited status through the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, Inc. The agency is compelled to operate within specific guidelines. It is accountable to the Commission. The agency must stay in compliance with the standards set forth by the Commission in order to retain its accreditation.



The Kenneth City Police Department is currently a CFA Florida Accredited Law Enforcement Agency.
